6th Grade Camp




Hopkins Middle School 6th Graders had the privilege of spending some time at the Outdoor Education Center located on Clear Lake in Dowling, MI.

Middle School Robotics


Hopkins Middle School students are busy working on the 2015 FIRST Robotics Tech Challenge. This year's challenge is to build a robot to climb a "mountain" and rescue climbers after an avalanche. The team has been working since September to concept/prototype and build a robot that can successfully do all of the game elements.

In the process they are learning teamwork, CAD design, machining, welding, wiring and programming. They are doing this all while having a lot of fun. Climbing the mountain proved to be very difficult. To accomplish the task the team modified a tank drive to include lugs made from surgical tubing and castrating rings. Now that is a bunch of creative farm kids.

The team will compete at Allendale Middle school on Dec. 5th. The event is free and very exciting. Come out and cheer on the Tech Vikes.

Hopkins FFA Earns 3 Star Recognition



Hopkins FFA Earns 3 Star Recognition and is Named Top 10 National Finalist in Community Development

The Hopkins FFA Chapter has been recognized in the 2015 National Chapter Award Program from the National FFA Organization as a three star chapter which is the highest award given. The program recognizes outstanding FFA chapters from throughout the country that successfully complete an annual set of required activities that encourage members to grow as individuals, work as a team and serve others in their communities. From over 600 applications submitted, only 1/3 of them were selected to receive this honor.

Chapters that received three star ratings were eligible to be selected to compete for the Model of Innovation Award. This award recognizes those chapters that demonstrate competency in doing new and innovative things or taking traditional concepts and applying a creative twist. Thirty chapters were selected to compete at the National FFA Convention through a presentation and interview process to highlight their chapters' activities in the student, chapter, and community development areas. Hopkins was selected as a top 10 national finalist in the community development division based on service projects completed within the community.

The chapter was recognized on stage at the National FFA Convention held October 28-31, 2015 in Louisville, KY. All winning chapters received honors made possible by corporate sponsor John Deere as a special project of the National FFA Foundation. "Feeding some 9 billion people by midcentury brings with it unprecedented challenges for today's farmers," said Amy Allen, Manager, national corporate contributions for John Deere. "The skills and experiences learned through the National Chapter Awards program will help meet the critical needs."
