#### **GUEST TEACHER REQUIREMENTS**

Per State of Michigan law, applicants must have one of the following to become a guest teacher:

- Current Michigan Teaching Certificate
- Expired Michigan Teaching Certificate.

  60+ credit hours from an accredited community college, or an accredited college or university with no less than a 2.0 GPA verified with official transcripts (acceptance of this minimum is at the discretion of each individual school district). Note: Requires a \$45.00 substitute teaching permit applied for by EDUStaff
- Out of State Teaching Certificate with transcripts showing 60+ credit hours from an accredited community college, or an accredited college or university with no less than a 2.0 GPA.
- Anyone working in a K-12 setting must be fingerprinted and pass a criminal history background

# **FREE MEALS** AVAILABLE


