Hopkins Public Schools: Fall Curriculum Updates

Elementary Schools Update:

New ELA Program - Open Court: The elementary schools have introduced a new English Language Arts (ELA)
program called Open Court. This program is likely to bring changes to how language arts is taught, incorporating
new teaching materials, methods, and approaches to improve students' reading, writing, and communication skills.
Teachers have undergone the initial training to effectively implement this new program and will receive training
throughout the implementation process.

Middle School Update:

ELA Program Review and Pilot: The middle school is in the process of reviewing ELA programs for grades 6-8. This
review is aimed at assessing the effectiveness of current programs and identifying areas for improvement. A pilot
program is scheduled for the 2024-25 school year, where selected programs will be tested in a controlled
environment to gather feedback from teachers and students. This feedback will be used to make informed decisions
about which program(s) to implement.

High School Update:

- Officiating Class: The high school added an officiating class to their schedule this year. Technology and an
 interactive website will help the instructor cover topics such as the rules and regulations of the specific sport(s) in
 officiating, along with game management, communication skills, conflict resolution, decision-making under
 pressure, and understanding the role of an official.
- Curriculum updates through Department Collaboration: This involves collaboration among various subject
 departments to identify areas for improvement, update content, incorporate new teaching methodologies, and
 align the curriculum with current educational standards. This collaborative approach can lead to a more integrated
 and effective curriculum that prepares students for higher education and beyond.

Specialized Instruction Update:

• The Middle School is adding three new reading intervention classes for grades 6-8. The intervention classes will provide explicit reading instruction to develop student's individual reading skills.

Remember that implementing these updates successfully requires careful planning, professional development for teachers, and ongoing assessment to measure their impact on student learning outcomes.

This meant that each core class teacher was asked to come up with a curriculum around a life skill or hobby the teacher was excited about. Current Events, Poetry, Tech Trends (including 3D printing and robotics), Digital Design, and Botany are just a few of the offerings you will find within the 7th-grade alone! Mr. Fisher, Ms. Klocke, Mr. Reszka, Mrs. Ruegsegger, and Ms. Schwartz all create classrooms that inspire and engage!

Those students interested in Band and Choir will have an opportunity to take these classes their entire secondary career. Mrs. Williams is an accomplished director who builds a family-type community in her band. We are lucky enough to be able to offer all students two-trimesters of PE and one trimester of Art each school year. Students with an inclination towards athletics or visual arts are pushed to new heights in a warm, encouraging environment thanks to Mrs. Klumpp, Mr. Hazen and Ms. Dana.

For those students who need a little extra help, we have a great team of specialists in Mrs. Irwin (Math) and Mrs. Meerman (ELA, formerly known as Ms. Barg).
