

Summer EBT is coming to Michigan!

This upcoming summer, eligible families will be able to receive money for select food items through the new Summer EBT program. The Pandemic EBT (P-EBT) program has officially ended. However, the United States Department of Agriculture has approved a permanent Summer EBT program for eligible households and school districts.

Summer EBT benefits can be used to purchase:

- fruits and vegetables
- meat, poultry, and fish
- dairy products
- breads and cereals
- other foods (such as snack foods and non-alcoholic beverages)

Applications are due NOW

To receive the Summer EBT benefit, every family must have an approved student eligibility benefit (free or reduced) through their school. Households may need to complete and submit the School Meals and Summer EBT Application. ***If you have already completed an application for 2023-2024, a new form is not needed.***

All families will need to turn in this form ahead of count day to receive benefits over the summer. Count day will be in early February 2024.

Eligibility Overview

Summer EBT benefits are available for eligible households based on their student eligibility status (free or reduced). This can be from direct certification, categorical eligibility, or from the School Meals and Summer EBT Application.
