#### Hopkins Elementary Fifth Grade Class Field Trip to Holland Outdoor Discovery Center





On November 10, the three fifth grade classes took a field trip to the Holland Outdoor Discovery Center to participate in their Native American Pathways program. The fifth graders had been recently studying the seven Native American Cultural Regions of North America, and this was an ideal opportunity to learn some more in depth information about how the Native Americans lived, particularly in the Midwest. The classes rotated through three stations led by a Discovery Center teacher.

Our first stop was at the archery range. The students received a lesson on how to throw a dart using an alatl. An atlatl is a long wooden rod that allows a dart to be thrown farther and with more force than simply using your arm. Many students were quite successful and their dart ended up piercing the ground several inches! After archery, students tried their fire making skills using just sticks.

The second stop was a native plant walk. Under the direction of the teacher, students learned which berries and plants could be eaten in the forests and how Native Americans used them for food. Students dined on wild grapes, berries and stag horn sumac. The sumac was a hit among students as it tasted like lemons! The Native Americans used it to make lemonade!

The last stop was at the Native American summer village. Students huddled inside a wigwam and learned about how these homes were used. All students also participated in moving a teepee, learning that Native Americans were a mobile people and often moved from place to place. Finally, students learned about the gardens that Native Americans used and took turns grinding corn into flour.

This was our first trip to the discovery center, and it was a great day of hands-on learning and fun!

# 2016 VIKE HIKE puts Principal VanBonn on the Roof!



The students exceeded that goal by raising over \$17,500! On October 27th, Mr. VanBonn climbed to the roof to his tent amid a group of spectators enjoying cider and donuts provided by HOPE. Our principal slept well and the students are now scheming to think of a new challenge for next year!





#### **Substitute Positions**



#### Hopkins Public Schools New Pay Rate and Incentive for Substitute Teachers

Hopkins Public Schools is announcing that they are increasing the pay rate for substitute teachers and offering new incentives to address the current sub shortage in the district.

The daily rate for day-to-day substitute teachers will increase from \$75 to \$80 for a full day. The half day rare for substitute teachers will increase from \$37.50 to \$45.

There will also be a bonus incentive added for the number of days a teacher subs in a month. Those subbing 10-14 days in a month will earn a \$100 bonus. Those subbing 15+ days in a month will earn a \$224 bonus. The number of days worked in a month does not need to be consecutive. This incentive does not apply to long-term subs.

Currently, the subs can eat free lunch in the school's cafeteria on the day they are teaching or they may choose an entrée form the adult lunch menu. In addition, the subs are entered into gift card drawings each day they sub in a building. There is a monthly drawing for one \$25 gift card per building.

In order to apply as a substitute teacher for the district, you must have an official transcript with 90+ semester credit hours and a minimum 2.0 GPA from a four-year accredited college or university.
