



The Hopkins Vikings boys varsity soccer team took home it's first District soccer championship this fall. The Vikings were victorious over Fennville 2 - 0 in the championship game with goals from seniors Brad Lowery and Joe Bala. The victory came after a season filled with adversity.

Following a 2-14-2 regular season playing a very competitive and tough schedule, the boys entered district play eager for a fresh start. Opening against the 10th ranked team in the state, Delton Kellogg, the game was an emotional affair. Early in the second half of overtime with the Vikings up 2-1, senior Hunter Lahaie suffered a serious injury which delayed the game to the next day where the guys prevailed in a shootout. With Hunter serving as an inspiration to the guys, the boys then picked up another upset at 18th ranked Paw Paw 1-0 with a late goal from Joe Bala. Joe had an amazing week scoring in all 3 district games.

The boys were really excited to be playing for a trophy and fortunately Hunter was released from the hospital the day before and was able to make it to the game and be on the sidelines with the team. Having Hunter there to celebrate with meant everything to the team. This was the boys 3rd district finals in 4 years and they brought home the trophy this year. Exciting times for the soccer program.












Motorists risk children's lives when they fail to stop for the school bus as it loads and unloads its passengers.
