Leading for Equity

In an effort to continually focus on achieving this vision, a team of administrators and teachers from the district are actively participating in a year long cohort at Kent County ISD titled: *Leading for Equity in Education*. During the 2019-20 school year, this team, which is made up of the superintendent, building principals and one teacher from each of the four schools will attend nine sessions. The desired outcomes of each session will continually build upon each other. Our goal is to build individual competency of educational equity and bring it back to the entire staff of Hopkins Public Schools.

Working towards equity in any educational system involves the following:

- Ensuring equally high outcomes for all participants in our educational system; removing the predictability of success or failures that currently correlates with any social or cultural factor
- Interrupting inequitable practices, examining biases, and creating inclusive multicultural school environments for adults and children
- Discovering and cultivating the unique gifts, talents and interests that every human possesses

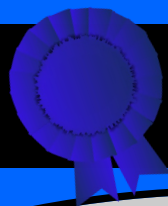

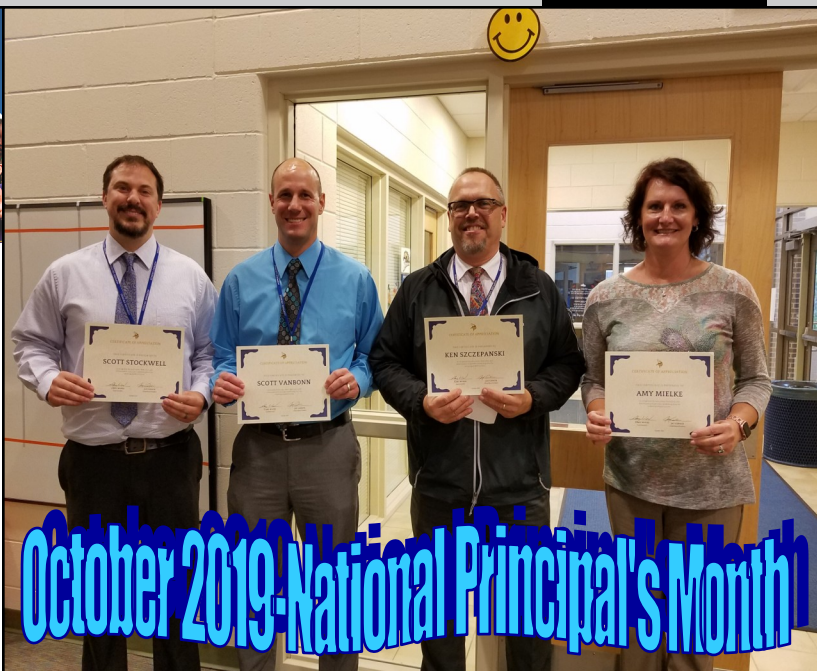

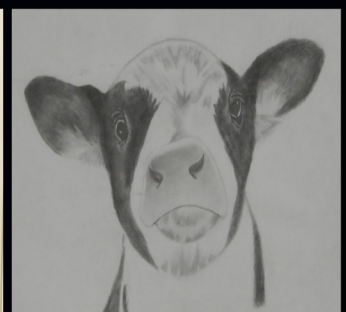
