**Improving Literacy** 

• Last summer our Reader Feeder paid a visit to over 100 children every two weeks. Our goal was to reduce the "summer slide" that affects many of our students by providing greater access to books. The data indicated that 88% of those that regularly participated had no summer slide and 67% actually increased their reading level.

• The state recently released the cut scores for 3rd grade reading proficiency. The good news for Hopkins is that if the law had been in effect for our most recently assessed third graders, none of our students, district-wide, would be subject to the retention policy. This is the result of the hard work and dedication of our outstanding staff and the interventions that have been put in place over the past few years.

#### **Sometimes Overlooked Clubs**

- Our robotics team finished the season ranked 17th in the state out of 542 teams and made it to the playoffs in the World Championships.
- For the first time ever, the Hopkins Equestrian team qualified for the State Championships.


# **Improving Facilities**



# SCHOOL GARDEN SEASON IS IN I

A group of students from the Hopkins FFA have planned another spectacular season of school gardening. The four garden beds, located beside the agricultural barn behind the high school, will be sown with theme gardens including a butterfly garden, a fairy garden, a three sisters garden and a garden full of oddities and puns, such as "Lettuce Turnip the Beet." A big thank you goes to Michigan Fine Herbs for the donation of herb plants for the school garden.

The FFA members also design lesson plans in garden and plant science. In May, the 2nd graders learned how to plant gardens and about the life cycle of a plant. On May 7th, the FFA garden team brought the Hopkins Elementary 2nd grade classes out to the school garden. They planted seeds in one of the gardens that the FFA members will be caring for this summer. They learned how deeply to plant the seed and how to properly cover the seed with dirt. They then learned how to thoroughly water and provide sunlight to plants in a garden. In addition, the young students learned about the life cycle of plants. They saw different seeds from various kinds of plants - including some sprouted seeds; they planted their own bean seeds to bring back to their classrooms to watch them grow; and they played a game of putting the life cycle of plants in order. At the end, the 2nd graders told the FFA garden team what they learned and why they find gardening fun.

A second science lesson is being planned for May 30th for the 2nd grade classrooms. The FFA students are meeting weekly to design activities that teach about insects in the garden, herbs, pollinators, and more. "Our goal is to get second graders excited about growing foods at home,"

said Ethan Gilder, a junior on the FFA garden team. "They learn a lot about science and nutrition from

this experience," he said.

Earlier this spring, the 2nd grade classrooms tried vermicomposting – composting their snack and lunch scraps with the help of red worms. A grant from the Hopkins School Board provided the materials to bring the experience to their classroom; it also gave the school garden a boost in soil quality. Anyone is invited to check out the school garden and enjoy the sights and scents found there. This April our high school students had the opportunity during a Spanish Club meeting to learn about and make a very common food found in the US and Latin America the tortilla! They learned about the history of maize in the Americas and the modern and ancient techniques for grinding and making authentic corn tortillas. After a presentation by Señor Miller, students were able to grind their own nixtamal (corn boiled in water and lime) with a hand-crank grinder. They then made a little ball of dough and put it in a tortilla press to make a beautiful,

home-made tortilla out of imported Mexican heirloom corn from a company called "Masienda" out of L.A. After putting their tortilla on a "comal" (griddle), they made a delicious taco al pastor (marinated pork taco) and dressed it with cilantro, onion. lime, and an authentic red or green salsa. They really enjoyed the experience and hope to do it again next year!



# Punch Passes



# Michigan DEQ Awards Grant to fund the "Hopkins Cares for Clean Air" Project.

Hopkins Schools is receiving a helping hand from the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) in its efforts to provide a clean air environment for our students and community. In April, Hopkins proposed project "Hopkins Cares for Clean Air" was accepted by the Michigan DEQ and grant funds were awarded to make a cleaner air environment for Hopkins.

The project addressed our air quality in Allegan County and the impact school bus emissions have on particle matter and greenhouse gasses. The goal of the project is to reduce emissions in our community by replacing two older model school buses with two new school buses that have improved emission ratings. The grant award reimburses the school up to 25% the cost of the new buses to encourage improved emission engines on the road and accelerate decommissioning of less efficient engines. In May, our new model year 2020 School buses #2 and #15 were placed in service and two engine year 2004 School buses have been retired.

A school bus placed in service has a 10-12 year lifespan before it gets decommissioned from the fleet. The Hopkins Cares for



Clean Air project utilized the DEQ's emissions quantifier tools to calculate the reduction in emissions over the span of a year, but more importantly to look at the tons per year emissions reductions over the lifetime of a school bus in our fleet. The impact this grant award has on our environment will be immediate and continue to be a benefit for years. Hopkins Schools strives to be a good steward of the environment we educate within. We would like to thank the State of Michigan DEQ for partnering with us in our efforts to care for clean air.
