The Thoughtful Classroom

As Principal in the high school I have the privilege to work with many wonderful people in many different capacities. The responsibility that I enjoy most are my visits to classrooms. Although it may put a little stress on the dynamics of a typical class period (I hear that students may behave a little more reserved) it is amazing to watch the interactions between the students and their teacher. The learning opportunities that are presented and the engagement of the students to the task at hand is the dance that happens daily within our walls five class periods per day. I know, through conversation, that the principals in each building enjoy their classroom visits. We visit thoughtful classrooms. Then what....?

How do we reflect upon what is observed in a classroom? How does this visit assist a teacher to be reflective about their profession? What is the impact on student learning? These are the questions at the core of our trade.

To address these questions... a few years ago, Hopkins Public Schools adopted the **Thoughtful Classroom Teacher Framework** as the teacher evaluation system. We chose this framework because we felt we could personally grow through our conversations about our practice.


We are reflective of our practices that are considered the "four cornerstones" of teaching:


- Organization, Rules and Procedures- Students know what is expected of them when they walk into a classroom. Teachers address vital non-instructional tasks.
- Positive Relationships- Necessary to encourage and enrich the student's learning experience.
- Engagement and Enjoyment- The interaction students have with their lesson and instruction.
- A Culture of Thinking and Learning- An environment and practice that brings rigor to learning.

We discuss the five dimensions of instruction that a teacher utilizes to get their content across to students. We discuss and plan how to improve practice in the following areas:

- Prepare Students for New Learning
- Presenting New Learning
- Deepening and Reinforcing Learning
- Applying Learning
- Reflecting On and Celebrating Learning

We are committed to the dimension of Professional Practice and Commitment to Professional Growth. This year one of our staff development focuses has been on whole-child education and how to build positive relationships by understanding the back-story of individual students and how to best help them. - Eggbert Activity: Students had to design a space shuttle to launch their egg and have it land without breaking. They learned basic engineering theories and used math in a practical application.
- Rocket Building: Students created rockets and were able to launch them outside. In this activity the students learned about the basics of force and motion.
- West Michigan College of Aviation Field Trip: A college student in the program took students on a tour of the hanger and old control tower. Students were also allowed to view different airplanes and discuss how they work.

MICHIGAN HISTORY

On Thursday, January 23rd, Don Cochrane from Camp Kaskitowa in Allegan came to Hopkins Elementary for a Michigan History presentation.

During the "Michigan 1763 Living History" presentation, students got to meet a Coureur de Bois (French-Canadian Independent fur trader) who helped them understand what life was like in Michigan 250 years ago. Students also learned about the impact Native American cultures (Potawatomi, Ojibwa, Ottawa, and Huron) and European Colonial cultures (French, British) had on each other in 1763 during Michigan's colonial period. At the end of the presentation, students learned about the tools and skills needed to survive in the North Woods over 250 years ago.
